2020 GSWG Annual Report

We illustrate in the following report the activities the Graduate Student Working Group performed since the January 2019 report:

Current officers include: Chandler Levinson from University of Georgia serving as Chair, Zara York from Washington State University serving as the Vice Chair, and Brittney Brewer-Jones from Montana State University serving as the Secretary.

As we prepare this report, we are transitioning leadership to Zara York (2020-2021 Chair) and Brittney Brewer-Jones (2020-2021 Vice Chair). The secretary position is currently vacant; however, we intend to recruit a candidate for the Secretary position before, during or after the 2020 Annual Meeting. The Chair and Vice Chair will manage the Secretary responsibilities should the position remain vacant.

The GSWG officers recruited subcommittee liaisons for committees deemed most crucial for the GSWG to have constant contact with, and these roles and individuals are:

- Planning: Anju Biswas (University of Florida) and Martin Costa (Texas A&M University)

The GSWG created a new subcommittee during 2019-2020 to provide a liaison for the Diversity Enhancement Award. This individual, Jodi Callwood (Delaware State University), was responsible for soliciting feedback from the 2019 mentors and mentees, discussing improvements with the executive committee, and working to enhance the experience for the 2020 annual meeting.
