This is the NAPB Borlaug Scholars Committee Annual Report to the Executive Committee for the 2021 Annual Meeting. This program was created in January 2018. The National Association of Plant Breeders (NAPB) was established in 2010 with the following mission: *The National Association of Plant Breeders strengthens plant breeding to promote food security, quality of life, and a sustainable future.*

The Vision of the NAPB Borlaug Scholars Committee: A sustainable annual flow of high-potential plant science students and emerging plant breeders into the professional community.

Our Mission: Selection of outstanding plant breeding students through national competition; funding these students to attend the NAPB Annual Meetings; mentoring of scholarship recipients during and after the annual meeting.

The ASF - NAPB Borlaug Scholars Fund has grown from \$30,000 at inception in January 2018 to a current balance of \$93,795.94 as of May 31, 2021. During the last four NAPB Annual Meetings, we have funded 62 scholars. 15% of the current fund balance is restricted to provide a spending floor. The Class of 2021 is comprised of 24 individuals, with 18 being graduate and 6 undergraduate students. The financial health of the fund remains strong and will support the Class of 2022.

2021 Highlights for the 2020 and 2021 Classes:

- Four mentoring workshops were held for the professional development of the 2020 Class. The 3rd event, a student organized workshop, is described below. The 4th event on June 29th featured 1996 World Food Prize Laureate, Dr. Gurdev Khush. All previous Borlaug Scholars were invited.
- NAPB scholar profiles have been publicized through the NAPB Newsletter, Website, Meeting Registration Website, Seed World, and social media channels.
- Introduction of the 2021 Class of Borlaug Scholars using their self-made 1 minute videos was highlighted during the NAPB Annual Meeting at Cornell University. This enables an expanded audience to meet each scholar.
- A Support-A Scholar Fundraiser virtual mentoring workshop, titled A Day in the Life of a Plant Breeder, was held March 2 with 98 participants. It was planned and organized by 2019 scholars Caio Canella Vieira and 2020 scholars Saarah Kuzay, Natalie Kaiser, Ammani Kyanam, and Chandler Levinson.



 The purpose of the event was to allow participants to ask questions of four plant breeders about their working careers, how Covid-19 affected their day-to-day work, and hear advice on starting a plant breeding career. The four plant breeders were Dr. JD Rossouw from Bayer CropScience, Dr. Sarah Potts from Corteva, Dr. Leandro Mozzoni from the University of Arkansas, and Dr. Stephanie Sjoberg from Syngenta,.



Nearly \$17,000 in sponsorship funds were raised from the institutions shown below, a
testament to the passion and organization of the five Borlaug Scholars who organized
the event and the continuing support from the larger plant breeding community.



- The web link was updated for 2021 nominations both for graduates and undergraduates to collect relevant information from nominees.
- All 2020 and 2021 scholars were provided a \$500 check for recognition of their selection in lieu of having expenses covered at an in-person meeting. Each scholar received complimentary student NAPB membership and free annual meeting registration also.
- Seed World interview podcasts were developed for NAPB Borlaug Scholars.

• For the Class of 2021, 24 Borlaug Scholars were chosen from 46 nominations submitted. Of the 24, 18 were graduate and 6 undergraduate students. The 24 total is a 33% increase from 2020 and the 6 undergraduates selected tripled the number from last year. Listed are the names of the 2021 Borlaug Scholars and the mentors for each.
