The Vision of the NAPB Borlaug Scholars Committee: *A sustainable annual flow of high-potential plant science students and emerging plant breeders into the professional community.*

Our Mission: Selection of outstanding plant breeding students through national competition; funding these students to attend the NAPB Annual Meetings; mentoring of scholarship recipients during and after the annual meeting.

The ASF - NAPB Borlaug Scholars Fund has grown from \$30,000 at inception in January 2018 to a current balance of **\$86,717.63**. During the last four NAPB Annual Meetings, we have funded 85 scholars.

2022 Highlights:

- NAPB Borlaug Scholars were given priority invitation and participation to several events including American Seed Trade Association Vegetable and Flower meetings in 2021 and 2022. This was led by Seed Central, UC Davis Plant Breeding Center and Seed Biotechnology Center. Corteva also hosted a NAPB Borlaug Scholar industry careers event.
- NAPB Borlaug scholars were highlighted at Crop Science Society, ASTA Corn, Soybean and Sorghum and ASTA veg and Flower meetings.
- NAPB scholar profiles have been publicized through the NAPB Newsletter, Website, Meeting Registration Website, Seed World, and social media channels.
- Introduction of the 2021 Class of Borlaug Scholars using their self-made 1-minute videos was highlighted during the NAPB Annual Meeting at Cornell University. This enables an expanded audience to meet each scholar.



2022 NAPB Borlaug Scholars Sponsors

- \$21,050 in sponsorship funds were raised from the institutions shown above in 2022, showing the continuing support from the greater plant breeding community. A portion of the contributions came from individuals too.
- All 2022 NAPB Borlaug Scholars received complementary membership and meeting registration, thanks to NAPB. They also will receive travel and accommodations expenses up to \$1500.
- In 2022, all scholars will attend the NAPB Borlaug Scholars/George Carver joint Breakfast to introduce them to the program, mentors and NAPB. The Borlaug Scholars breakfast is once again sponsored by Inari.
- SeedWorld interview podcasts are being developed for NAPB Borlaug Scholars at the meeting.

2022 Borlaug Scholars and Mentors

• For the Class of 2022, 23 Borlaug Scholars were chosen from 68 nominations submitted. Of the 23, 11 were Phd, 2 MSc. and 7 undergraduate students. A targeted effort was made to improve undergraduate applications. Thanks to Ana Mari Heilman Morales. Although, 23 is one less than the 24 (online) students supported last year, it is 11 more than we supported at the last in-person meeting in 2019. This represents the health of the program. Thus far, we have supported 85 scholars since 2018. The below Table lists the new scholars and mentors. Note we have several new mentors and past scholars that are now mentors and committee members for NAPB.
