In addition to leading scientific research, the Director will oversee capacity- building initiatives, resource mobilization, and stakeholder coordination to further CRCIL's objectives.
	 Duties/Responsibilities: Ensure CRCIL's research and engagement outcomes align with its mission. Serve as USAID's principal contact for the program. Represent CRCIL publicly to the U.S. Government, research communities, and stakeholders. Oversee program planning, activity coordination, reporting, and evaluation. Facilitate cross-learning and collaboration between internal and external partners. Manage integration of Associate Awards and buy-ins into the broader Innovation Lab.

CRCIL's mission is to advance climate-resilient cereal breeding systems across Feed the Future countries, leveraging cutting-edge agricultural science to address local needs and preferences.
